

Planting Tips

Plant tomato plants as deep as the stem will allow, removing all leaves that will be below the soil line.

Cover the soil with mulch the day you plant (fresh grass clippings, straw, etc.), this will help keep soil born blight at bay. Keep piling those grass clippings around the base of your plant! Your plant will love it and you'll improve the quality of your soil.

The pot is biodegradable and can be planted after the bottom is torn.

Plan on supporting your tomato plant the day you plant. Tomato cages with stakes are a good choice.

Use an organic tomato fertilizer through the growing season like Espoma Organic Tomato-tone.

As your tomato plant grows, remove bottom leaves closest to soil and any yellow leaves.

When watering, it is important to remember not to water the foliage regularly. Dry foliage is healthy foliage.
